

*Massey Energy Regional Headquarters

The three-story, 51,000 square foot building is in Boone County. It employs approximately 120 people. Massey consolidated its Charleston and Chapmanville offices, putting the company closer to mining operations in southern West Virginia. The building features a cafeteria and fitness center. This project means \$120,000 in annual tax revenue for the county.

*The Bechtel Family National Scouting Reserve

Also known as The Summit, it's a 10,600 acre adventure center operated by the Boy Scouts of America and the new permanent home of the National Scout Jamboree. It is set to open in 2013. It will be the location of a summer camp and leadership training center. More than 50,000 boy scouts are expected to visit the reserve annually, except every fourth year during Jamboree years. That's when an additional 40,000 or more scouts and tens of thousands of guests are expected to visit. Anywhere from 100,000 to 300,000 visitors could visit the reserve through the ten-day Jamboree period.

*Mount Hope Industrial Park

Four businesses currently occupy the park. Mayor Michael Martin says these businesses bring new families into the community who contribute in so many ways as residents.

*Mount Olive Correctional Complex

Opened in 1995 to replace the Moundsville Penitentiary. It was built on a 92-acre mountaintop removal mine in Fayette County. West Virginia Correctional Industries operates an engraving shop, sign shop, welding/metal shop and janitorial supply factory at the complex. Road signs for the Division of Highways, license plates for the Division of Motor Vehicles and campsite products for State Parks and Forests are also made there.

*NedPower Mount Storm Wind Farm

Fully operational and generates up to 264 megawatts of electricity from a renewable energy source for the mid-Atlantic power grid. The farm consists of 132 wind turbines along 12 miles of the Allegheny Front. It can generate enough electricity to serve about 66,000 homes and businesses.

*Beech Ridge wind project

\$300 million, 119-wind turbine wind farm under construction in Greenbrier County. Each wind turbine is 400 feet tall and will generate 1.5 megawatts of electricity. Skilled West Virginia construction workers are building the project and there are plans to hire a full-time local operations team.

*Pete Dye Golf Course

This abandoned coal mine is now a golf course in Bridgeport that encompasses about 180 acres, but crews cleaned up close to 600 acres in the area.

*FBI Complex

Located on 986 acres of reclaimed mine land in Clarksburg. More than 2000 people were hired from the local area when it opened in 1995. Turnover in the fingerprint division was once 25% a year. It has dropped to less than 1%.

*Meadowbrook Mall

Located on I-79 in Bridgeport. It encompasses nearly 1 million square feet of retail space. It has served north-central West Virginia since it opened in 1982.

*Charles Pointe

A \$1.4 billion dollar state-of-the-art mixed use community spanning more than 1,700 acres in Bridgeport along the I-79 high-tech corridor. It combines commercial, residential, and recreational opportunities in one community.

*Weirton Medical Center

A 238-bed, non-profit, acute-care, general community hospital in Brooke County. It offers health0care services to the residents of West Virginia, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

*Chief Logan Convention Center

Located on 800 acres of reclaimed surface mine land. The center is a 20,000 square foot facility with the capacity to host several hundred people at one time or smaller groups. The adjacent hotel offers 75 rooms and suites. The facility enhances the Hatfield-McCoy Trail, Chief Logan State park and brings visitors to southern West Virginia.

*Logan County Airport

The airport serves both private and commercial customers with a 3600 foot lighted runway and three private hangars. The airport also offers walking trails, campsites for hunters and spectacular scenic views in all seasons. A one-acre pond on airport property is stocked and available for fishermen.

*McDowell County Industrial Park

Since the county is more than 90% hillside, land for economic development is in short supply. A \$224 million federal prison is this park's anchor. There are plans to locate a wellness and educational center at the park.

*Mount View High School

One of two schools in the Welch area. 47 courses are taught to approximately 830 students in grades 6-12. In the evenings, classes from Bluefield State College are offered here.

*Mingo County Fish Hatchery

Raises fish free of mercury, PCB's and other toxins using clean, cold water from nearby underground coal mines.

***Unilin Flooring (not Union)**

Workers produce laminate floors, engineered wood, melamine chipboards, roofing elements and insulating panels. A \$45 million capital investment at Mingo County's 650-acre Wood Products Industrial Park when it opened in 2001.

***Coal Mac, Inc.**

This subsidiary of Arch Coal has an administrative building in a rehabilitated coal office structure at Mingo County's Wood Products Industrial Park.

***Quality Metal Roofing**

Located at Mingo County's Wood Products Industrial Park. Employees help customers with all aspects of metal roof installation.

***Mingo County Airport**

Currently under construction. The airport will have a 7,000 foot runway. An additional 800 acres of developable property are being created next to the airport which will allow more businesses and industry to locate there.

***Mingo County Consolidated High School**

\$39 million dollar new school will consolidate Gilbert, Williamson, Matewan and Burch High Schools when it opens in August 2011. The school is located on reclaimed mine property atop a mountain between Red Jacket and Varney. 850 students will attend.

***King Coal Highway**

Interstate highway that unlocks 1500 acres of Mingo County land for development. It will cut travel time in half when compared with the existing US 52.

***Twin Branch Motorsports Complex**

55 acre site about 15 miles north of Williamson. The proposed facility will seat approximately 20,000 spectators and include camping areas and parking for more than 6,000 vehicles.

***Twisted Gun Golf Course**

An 18-hole, PGA-type course on Horsepen Mountain in Wharnclyff. There are four sets of tees to accommodate all skill levels. The wide, rolling fairways take advantage of the prevailing winds.

*Mingo County Horticultural Demonstration Site

Enabled the county Board of Education to provide a horticultural curriculum. It's operated and maintained by students.

*Hatfield McCoys Trail System

One of 16 trail systems in the country designated as a National Millenium Trail. Those trails tell the story of our nation's past and help create a positive vision of our future. This trail system includes more than 500 miles of trails in several counties. The project has pumped more than \$7 million into the local economy since 2000.

*Mylan Park

A state-of-the-art recreational and educational complex located on over 300 acres of reclaimed surface-mined property just minutes from downtown Morgantown. It improves quality of life for residents and visitors to the area.

*Chaplin Hill Business Park

Home to FCX Systems. The company manufactures converters and preconditioned air equipment for military and commercial aviation in Morgantown. FCX exports to customers in 70 countries.

*Morgantown Mall

*Longview Power Plant

The plant is being constructed in Madsville. It will be one of the cleanest, most efficient solid-fuel power plants in the United States when it starts operating in 2011.

*Columbia Wood Products

Workers produce inner plys and core veneers to be used as core material in plywood and flooring manufactured at other Columbia facilities. The company located in Nicholas County because of its strong resource of renewable Poplar forest and its available labor force.

*Department of Highways, Nicholas County

*WV Metal Wholesalers

A sheet metal manufacturing company in Muddlety. Workers manufacture and distribute coated metal roofing and siding using roll form technology. This company is the only distributor of 100-year metal roofs in West Virginia.

*Burning Rock Off-Road Park

8000 acre adventure park in Raleigh County offers 90 miles of trails for ATV and motorcyclists. Trails take riders through once-bustling coal towns of Stotesbury and Tams. The campground and cabins were built on a reclaimed coal refuse pile that was converted into 60 acres of flat land. The park also has a half-mile long zipline with a 300-foot vertical drop.

*Linda Epling Stadium

2,600 seat baseball park in Beckley features a high-tech Field Turf playing surface, scoreboard, video screen and paved parking lot. It can also be utilized for youth sports and community events

*YMCA Paul Cline Youth Sports Complex

A state-of-the-art multi-purpose facility that includes eight soccer fields (two with stadium seating) with lights and soccer-specific scoreboards. The complex also has two conference rooms for meetings, a concession stand with covered picnic shelter, a 1.5 mile walking trail, and playground. The complex has hosted special events including the WVSSAC State Soccer Tournament.

*Coal City Elementary

Serves approximately 300 students in Raleigh County

*Independence Middle School

Serves approximately 500 students in Raleigh County

*Independence High School

Serves approximately 700 students in Raleigh County

*Raleigh County landfill

Built on an area that was mined in the 1940s. Currently contains approximately 14 years worth of garbage. Eventually will be the highest mountain in the area as it expands to accommodate more.
